Levoplant is a highly effective long-acting reversible contraceptive that is WHO prequalified for up to 3 years of use. Dr. Matt Reeves will lead participants through the medical eligibility criteria in addition to steps for pre- and post-insertion care and counselling. The session will include a demonstration of how to properly insert and remove the implant.
